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**MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION\***

**YORKSHIRE YOGA**

**Company Number 5368620**

1. The name of the company (hereinafter called "the Charity") is "Yorkshire Yoga".
2. The registered office of the Charity will be situated in England and Wales.
3. The objects for which the Charity is established are to promote, encourage and advance for the public benefit the study and practice of and research into yoga and related Group 1 and 2 therapies from the relevant House of Lords report (hereinafter called 'related therapies') or sport as a means of improving the mental physical and spiritual health of the community and to publish the useful results of any such research.

**AND** the Charity shall have the following powers exercisable in furtherance of its said objects but not further or otherwise, namely:-

- 3.1 to advance the education of the public in yoga and related therapies or sport;
- 3.2 to serve as a training centre for yoga teachers and therapists;
- 3.3 to encourage community participation in yoga and related therapies or sport by the provision of facilities and instruction which are open to all ages, all levels of ability or disability, and all races, religions and socio-economic groups;
- 3.4 to promote, improve and protect good health and well-being through the practice of yoga and related therapies or sport;
- 3.5 to assist in the treatment and care of adults and children of all ages suffering from physical and or mental disabilities by providing yoga and related therapies or sport to those persons and their families;
- 3.6 to research develop and advance the study of yoga and related therapies or sport as a means of improving the physical, mental and spiritual health of the community;
- 3.7 to use research findings to inform, publish and raise awareness of the significant complementary, educational and beneficial value of yoga and related therapies or sport to health care at community, regional and national levels;
- 3.8 to offer for hire any premises owned or rented by the Charity as a facility for appropriate community events, including other sports;

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- 3.9 to provide an on-premises facility for beneficiaries to purchase equipment, books, DVDs and CDs related to the practice of yoga and other related therapies or sport;
- 3.10 to purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire real or personal property and rights or privileges and to construct, convert, maintain and alter buildings or erections whether for its own use or otherwise;
- 3.11 to sell, let or mortgage, dispose of or turn to account all or any of the property or assets of the Charity;
- 3.12 to purchase or otherwise acquire plant and machinery including computer hardware and software, furniture, fixtures, fittings and all other effects of every description and to apply for registration of any patents, rights, copyrights, licences and the like;
- 3.13 to borrow or raise money on such terms and on such security as may be thought fit with such consents as are required by law provided that in raising funds the Charity shall not undertake any substantial permanent trading activities and shall conform to any relevant statutory regulations;
- 3.14 to take and accept any gift of money, property or other assets of any description whether subject to any special trust or not;
- 3.15 to issue appeals, recruit volunteers, hold public meetings, and take such steps as may be required for the purpose of procuring contributions to the funds of the Charity in the shape of donations, subscriptions or otherwise;
- 3.16 to draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills, cheques and other instruments and to operate bank accounts;
- 3.17 to invest monies of the Charity not immediately required for its purposes in or upon such investments, securities or property as may be thought fit subject nevertheless to such conditions (if any) and such consents (if any) as may for the time being be imposed or required by law;
- 3.18 to make any donations in cash or assets or establish or support or aid in the establishment or support of and to lend money (with or without security) to or for any charitable associations or institutions whether such charitable associations or institutions have a common object or otherwise;
- 3.19 to undertake and execute charitable trusts;
- 3.20 to engage and pay any person or persons whether on a full time or part-time basis or whether as consultant or employee to supervise, organise, carry on the work of and advise the Charity and, subject to the provisions of Clause 4 hereof, to make any reasonable and necessary provision for the payment of pensions and superannuation to or on behalf of employees or former employees and their wives, husbands and other dependants;
- 3.21 to amalgamate with any charitable companies, institutes, societies or associations which shall have objects altogether or mainly similar to those of the Charity and prohibit payment of any dividend or profit to and the distribution of any of their assets among their members at least to the same extent as such payments or distributions are prohibited in the case of members of the Charity by this Memorandum of Association;
- 3.22 to pay out of funds of the Charity any costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the formation and registration of the Charity;
- 3.23 to do all such other lawful things as shall further the attainment of the objects of the Charity or any of them.
- 3.24 the payment of any premium in respect of any indemnity insurance to cover the liability of the members and/or Trustee-Directors which by virtue of any rule of law would otherwise attach to them in respect of any negligence default breach of trust or breach of duty of which they may be guilty in relation to the Charity provided that any such insurance shall not extend to any claim arising from liability resulting from conduct which the member or Trustee-Director knew or must be assumed to have known was not in the

best interests of the Charity or which the Trustee-Director or member, as the case may be, did not care whether it was in the best interests of the Charity or not and provided also that any such insurance shall not extend to any claim arising from liability for the costs of unsuccessfully defending criminal prosecutions for offences arising out of the fraud or dishonesty or willful or reckless misconduct of the member or Trustee-Director, as the case may be.

#### **NOT-FOR-PROFIT STATUS**

4. The income and property of the Charity shall be applied solely towards the promotion of its objects as set forth in this Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise howsoever by way of profit, to members of the Charity **PROVIDED** that nothing herein shall prevent any payment in good faith by the Charity:
  - 4.1 of reasonable and proper remuneration of any officer or servant of the Charity (not being a Trustee-Director) for any services rendered to the Charity and of travelling expenses necessarily incurred in carrying out the duties of such person or persons aforesaid;
  - 4.2 of interest on money lent by a member or Trustee-Director of the Charity at a rate per annum not exceeding two percentage points less than the base lending rate for the time being of the Charity's clearing bankers or 3% whichever is the greater;
  - 4.3 of reasonable out-of-pocket expenses to any Trustee-Director;
  - 4.4 of the usual professional charges for business done by any Trustee-Director or connected person who is a solicitor, accountant or other appropriately qualified person, when instructed by the Charity to act in a professional or consultative capacity on its behalf; except that at no time shall a majority of the members of the Charity or of the Trustee-Directors benefit under this provision and provided that any such member or Trustee-Director shall withdraw from any meeting at which his or her appointment or remuneration or that of his or her connected person is under discussion;
  - 4.5 of fees, remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth to a Company of which a member of the Charity or a Trustee-Director may be a member holding not more than one-hundredth part of the capital of such Company;
  - 4.6 of reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member of the Charity or any Trustee-Director.
5. The liability of the members is limited.
6. Every member of the Charity undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Charity, in the event of the same being wound up while he is a member, or within one year after he ceases to be a member, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Charity contracted before he ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding one pound (£1.00)

#### **DISSOLUTION**

7. If the Charity is wound up or dissolved and after all its debts and liabilities have been satisfied there remains any property, it shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Charity, but shall be given or transferred to some other Company or charities having objects similar to the objects which prohibits the distribution of its or their income and property to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Charity by Clause 4 above, chosen by the members of the Charity at or before the time of dissolution and if that cannot be done then to some other charitable object.

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**ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION\***

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## INTERPRETATION

1. In these Articles:
  - "THE ACT"** : means the Companies Act 2006 including any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force
  - "THE ARTICLES"** : means these Articles of Association as amended from time to time
  - "CLEAR DAYS"** : in relation to the period of a notice means that period excluding the day when the notice is given or deemed to be given and the day for which it is given or on which it is to take effect
  - "THE CHARITY"** : means Yorkshire Yoga
  - "EXECUTED"** : includes any mode of execution
  - "OFFICE"** : means the registered office of the Charity
  - "THE SEAL"** : means the Common Seal of the Charity (if any)
  - "SECRETARY"** : means the Secretary of the Charity or any other person appointed to perform the duties of the Secretary of the Charity, including a joint assistant or deputy secretary
  - "THE UNITED KINGDOM"** : means Great Britain and Northern Ireland
  - "TRUSTEE-DIRECTOR/TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS"**: means a trustee or trustees of the Charity from time to time and having the same powers as a director or directors as defined in the Act

Unless the context otherwise requires, words or expressions contained in these Articles bear the same meaning as in the Act but excluding any statutory modification thereof not in force when these Articles become binding on the Charity.

## MEMBERS

2. The subscribers to the Memorandum of Association of the Charity and such other persons as are admitted to membership in accordance with the Articles shall be members of the Charity.
3. No person shall be admitted a member of the Charity unless he is approved by the Trustee-Directors and every person who wishes to become a member shall deliver to the Charity an application for membership in such form as the Trustee-Directors require executed by him.
4. A member may at any time withdraw from the Charity by giving at least seven (7) clear days' notice to the Charity. Membership shall not be transferable and shall cease on death.
5. The Trustee-Directors may also at their discretion terminate the membership of any member but the requirements of natural justice shall be respected and a member shall be entitled to be heard in his own defence by the Trustee-Directors or a committee of the Trustee-Directors.
6. The Charity is established for the purposes expressed in the Memorandum of Association.

## **GENERAL MEETINGS**

7. The Charity shall in each calendar year hold a general meeting as its annual general meeting in addition to any other meetings in that year and shall specify the meeting as such in the notices calling it; and not more than fifteen (15) months shall elapse between the date of one annual general meeting of the Charity and that of the next and provided that so long as the Charity holds its first annual general meeting within eighteen (18) months of its incorporation, it need not hold it in the year of its incorporation or in the following year. The annual general meeting in each year shall be held at such time and place as the Trustee-Directors shall appoint.
8. All general meetings other than annual general meetings shall be called extraordinary general meetings.
9. The Trustee-Directors may call general meetings and, on the requisition of members, shall forthwith proceed to convene an extraordinary general meeting for a date not later than eight (8) weeks after receipt of the requisition. If there are not within the United Kingdom sufficient Trustee-Directors to call a general meeting, any Trustee-Director or any member of the Charity may call a general meeting.

## **NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETINGS**

10. An annual general meeting and an extraordinary general meeting called for the passing of a special resolution or a resolution appointing a person as a Trustee-Director shall be called by at least twenty one (21) Clear Days' notice.
11. All other extraordinary general meetings shall be called by at least fourteen (14) Clear Days' notice but a general meeting may be called by shorter notice if it is so agreed:
  - (a) in the case of an annual general meeting, by all the members entitled to attend and vote thereat; and
  - (b) in the case of any other meeting by a majority in number of the members having a right to attend and vote being a majority together holding not less than 95 per cent (95%) of the total voting rights at the meeting of all the membersThe notice shall specify the time and the place of the meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted and, in the case of an annual general meeting, shall specify the meeting as such.
12. The notice shall be given to all the members and to the Trustee-Directors and auditors.
13. The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to, or the non-receipt of notice of a meeting by, any person entitled to receive notice shall not invalidate the proceedings at that meeting.

## **PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS**

14. No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present being two persons or one third of the members (whichever shall be the greater) entitled to vote upon the business to be transacted, each being a member or a proxy for a member or a duly authorised representative of a corporation, shall be a quorum.
15. If such a quorum is not present within half (1/2) an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, or if during a meeting such a quorum ceases to be present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place or to such other time as the Trustee-Directors may determine and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half (1/2) an hour from the time appointed for the meeting those present and entitled to vote shall be a quorum.
16. The chairman, if any, of the board of Trustee-Directors or in his absence some other Trustee-Director nominated by the Trustee-Directors shall preside as chairman of the meeting, but if neither the chairman nor such other Trustee-Director (if any) be present within fifteen (15) minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting and willing to act, the Trustee-Directors present shall elect one of their number to be chairman

and, if there is only one (1) Trustee-Director present and willing to act, he shall be chairman.

17. If no Trustee-Director is willing to act as chairman, or if no Trustee-Director is present within fifteen (15) minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the members present and entitled to vote shall choose one of their number to be chairman.
18. A Trustee-Director shall, notwithstanding that he is not a member, be entitled to attend and speak at any general meeting.
19. The chairman may, with the consent of a meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting), adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at an adjourned meeting other than business which might properly have been transacted at the meeting had the adjournment not taken place.
20. When a meeting is adjourned for fourteen (14) days or more, at least seven (7) Clear Days' notice shall be given specifying the time and place of the adjourned meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted otherwise it shall not be necessary to give any such notice.
21. A resolution put to the vote of a meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless before, or on the declaration of the result of, the show of hands a poll is duly demanded. Subject to the provisions of the Act, a poll may be demanded:
  - (a) by the chairman; or
  - (b) by at least two (2) members having the right to vote at the meeting; or
  - (c) by a member or members representing not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the total voting rights of all the members having the right to vote at the meeting;and a demand by a person as proxy for a member shall be the same as a demand by the member.
22. Unless a poll is duly demanded a declaration by the chairman that a resolution has been carried or carried unanimously, or by a particular majority, or lost, or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against the resolution.
23. The demand for a poll may, before the poll is taken, be withdrawn but only with the consent of the chairman and a demand so withdrawn shall not be taken to have invalidated the result of a show of hands declared before the demand was made.
24. A poll shall be taken as the chairman directs and he may appoint scrutineers (who need not be members) and fix a time and place for declaring the result of the poll. The result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.
25. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the chairman shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any other vote he may have.
26. A poll demanded on the election of a chairman or on a question of adjournment shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken either forthwith or at such other time and place as the chairman directs not being more than thirty (30) days after the poll is demanded. The demand for a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which the poll was demanded. If a poll is demanded before the declaration of the result of a show of hands and the demand is duly withdrawn, the meeting shall continue as if the demand had not been made.
27. No notice need be given of a poll not taken forthwith if the time and place at which it is to be taken are announced at the meeting at which it is demanded and in any other case at least seven (7) Clear Days' notice shall be given specifying the time and place at which the poll is to be taken.
28. A resolution in writing executed by or on behalf of each member who would have been entitled to vote upon it if it had been proposed at a general meeting at which he was present shall be as effectual as if it had been passed at a general meeting duly

convened and held and may consist of several instruments in the like form each executed by or on behalf of one or more members.

### VOTES OF MEMBERS

29. On a show of hands every member present in person shall have one (1) vote and on a poll every member present in person or by proxy shall have one vote.
30. A member in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction (whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere) in matters concerning mental disorder may vote, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, by his receiver, curator bonis or other person authorised in that behalf appointed by that court and any such receiver, curator bonis or other person may, on a poll, vote by proxy. Evidence to the satisfaction of the Trustee-Directors of the authority of the person claiming to exercise the right to vote shall be deposited at the office, or at such other place as is specified in accordance with the Articles for the deposit of instruments of proxy, not less than forty eight (48) hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the right to vote is to be exercised and in default the right to vote shall not be exercisable.
31. No objection shall be raised to the qualification of any voter except at the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote objected to is tendered and every vote not disallowed at the meeting shall be valid. Any objection made in due time shall be referred to the chairman whose decision shall be final and conclusive.
32. An instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing, executed by or on behalf of the appointer and shall be in the following form (or in a form as near thereto as circumstances allow or in any other form which is usual of which the Trustee-Directors may approve):

- 34.** The instrument appointing a proxy and any authority under which it is executed or a copy of such authority certified notarially or in some other way approved by the Trustee-Directors may:
- (a) be deposited at the office or such other place within the United Kingdom as is specified in the notice convening the meeting or in any instrument of proxy sent out by the Charity in relation to the meeting not less than forty eight (48) hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote; or
  - (b) in the case of a poll taken more than forty eight (48) hours after it is demanded, be deposited as aforesaid after the poll has been demanded and not less than twenty four (24) hours before the time appointed for the taking of the poll; or
  - (c) where the poll is not taken forthwith but is taken not more than forty eight (48) hours after it was demanded, be delivered at the meeting at which the poll was demanded to the chairman or to the Secretary or to any Trustee-Director;
- and an instrument to proxy which is not deposited or delivered in a manner so permitted shall be invalid.
- 35.** A vote given or poll demanded by proxy or by the duly authorised representative of a corporation shall be valid notwithstanding the previous determination of the authority of the person voting or demanding a poll unless notice of the determination was received by the Charity at the Office or at such other place at which the instrument of proxy was duly deposited before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the vote is given or the poll demanded or (in the case of a poll taken otherwise than on the same day as the meeting or adjourned meeting) the time appointed for taking the poll.

#### **NUMBER OF TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS**

- 36.** Unless otherwise determined by ordinary resolution, the number of Trustee-Directors shall not be subject to any maximum but shall be not less than three (3).

#### **POWERS OF TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS**

- 37.** Subject to the provisions of the Act, the Memorandum and the Articles and to any directions given by special resolution, the business of the Charity shall be managed by the Trustee-Directors who may exercise all the powers of the Charity.
- 38.** No alteration of the Memorandum or Articles and no such direction shall invalidate any prior act of the Trustee-Directors which would have been valid if that alteration had not been made or that direction had not been given.
- 39.** The powers given by this regulation shall not be limited by any special power given to the Trustee-Directors by the Articles and a meeting of Trustee-Directors at which a quorum is present may exercise all powers exercisable by the Trustee-Directors.

#### **DELEGATION OF TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS' POWERS**

- 40.** The Trustee-Directors may delegate any of their powers to any committee consisting of one or more Trustee-Director or other persons and they may also delegate to any managing Trustee-Director or any Trustee-Director holding any other executive office such of their powers as they consider desirable to be exercised by him. Any such delegations may be made subject to any conditions the Trustee-Directors may impose, and either collaterally with or to the exclusion of their own powers and may be revoked or altered. Subject to any such conditions, the proceedings of a committee with two or more members shall be governed by the Articles regulating the proceedings of Trustee-Directors so far as they are capable of applying.

## **APPOINTMENT AND RETIREMENT OF TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS**

41. At the first annual general meeting all the Trustee-Directors shall retire from office, and at every subsequent annual general meeting one-third (1/3) of the Trustee-Directors who are subject to retirement by rotation or, if their number is not three (3) or a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to one-third (1/3) shall retire from office, but if there is only one Trustee-Director who is subject to retirement by rotation, he shall retire.
42. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the Trustee-Directors to retire by rotation shall be those who have been longest in office since their last appointment or re-appointment but as between persons who became or were last re-appointed Trustee-Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.
43. If the Charity, at the meeting at which a Trustee-Director retires by rotation, does not fill the vacancy the retiring Trustee-Director shall, if willing to act, be deemed to have been re-appointed unless at the meeting it is resolved not to fill the vacancy or unless a resolution for the re-appointment of the Trustee-Director is put to the meeting and lost.
44. No person other than a Trustee-Director retiring by rotation shall be appointed or re-appointed a Trustee-Director at any general meeting unless:
  - (a) he is recommended by the Trustee-Directors; or
  - (b) not less than fourteen (14) nor more than thirty five (35) Clear Days before the date appointed for the meeting, notice executed by a member qualified to vote at the meeting has been given to the Charity of the intention to propose that person for appointment or re-appointment stating the particulars which would, if he were so appointed or re-appointed, be required to be included in the Charity's register of Trustee-Directors together with notice executed by that person of his willingness to be appointed or re-appointed.
45. Not less than seven (7) nor more than twenty eight (28) Clear Days before the date appointed for holding a general meeting notice shall be given to all who are entitled to receive notice of the meeting of any person (other than a Trustee-Director retiring by rotation at the meeting) who is recommended by the Trustee-Directors for appointment or re-appointment as a Trustee-Director at the meeting or in respect of whom notice has been duly given to the Charity of the intention to propose him at the meeting for appointment or re-appointment as a Trustee-Director. The notice shall give the particulars of that person which would, if he were so appointed or re-appointed, be required to be included in the Charity's register of Trustee-Directors.
46. Subject as aforesaid, the Charity may by ordinary resolution appoint a person who is willing to act to be a Trustee-Director either to fill a vacancy or as an additional Trustee-Director and may also determine the rotation in which any additional Trustee-Directors are to retire.
47. The Trustee-Directors may appoint a person who is willing to act to be a Trustee-Director, either to fill a vacancy or as an additional Trustee-Director, provided that the appointment does not cause the number of Trustee-Directors to exceed any number fixed by or in accordance with the Articles as the maximum number of Trustee-Directors and a Trustee-Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting and shall not be taken into account in determining the Trustee-Directors who are to retire by rotation at the meeting. If not re-appointed at such annual general meeting, he shall vacate his office at the conclusion thereof.
48. Subject as aforesaid, a Trustee-Director who retires at an annual general meeting may, if willing to act, be re-appointed. If he is not re-appointed he shall retain office until the meeting appoints someone in his place, or if it does not do so, until the end of the meeting.

## **DISQUALIFICATION AND REMOVAL OF TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS**

49. The office of a Trustee-Director shall be vacated if:
  - (a) he ceases to be a Trustee-Director by virtue of any provision of the Act or he becomes prohibited by law from being a Trustee-Director;

- (b) he becomes bankrupt or makes any arrangement or composition with his creditors generally; or
- (c) he is, or may be, suffering from mental disorder and either:
  - (i) he is admitted to hospital in pursuance of an application for admission for treatment under the Mental Health Act 1983 or, in Scotland, an application for admission under the Mental Health (Scotland) Act 1984; or
  - (ii) an order is made by a court having jurisdiction (whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere) in matters concerning mental disorder for his detention or for the appointment of a receiver, curator bonis or other person to exercise powers with respect to his property or affairs; or
- (d) he resigns his office by notice to the Charity; or
- (e) he shall for more than six (6) consecutive months have been absent without permission of the Trustee-Directors from meetings of Trustee-Directors held during that period and the Trustee-Directors resolve that his office be vacated.

#### **TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS' EXPENSES**

- 50.** The Trustee-Directors may be paid all travelling, hotel and other expenses properly incurred by them in connection with their attendance at meetings of Trustee-Directors or committee of Trustee-Directors or general meetings or separate meetings of the holders of debentures of the Charity or otherwise in connection with the discharge of their duties.

#### **TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS' APPOINTMENTS AND INTERESTS**

- 51.** Subject to the provisions of the Act and the Memorandum of Association and provided that he has disclosed to the Trustee-Directors the nature and extent of any material interest of his, a Trustee-Director notwithstanding his office:
- (a) may be a party to, or otherwise be interested in, any transaction or arrangement with the Charity or in which the Charity is otherwise interested;
  - (b) may be a Trustee-Director or other officer of, or employed by, or a party to any transaction or arrangement with, or otherwise interested in, any body corporate promoted by the Charity or in which the Charity is otherwise interested; and
  - (c) shall not, by reason of his office, be accountable to the Charity for any benefit which he derives from any such office or employment from any such transaction or arrangement or from any interest in any such body corporate and no such transaction or arrangement shall be liable to be avoided on the ground of any such interest or benefit.

#### **PROCEEDINGS OF TRUSTEE-DIRECTORS**

- 52.** Subject to the provisions of the Articles, the Trustee-Directors may regulate their proceedings as they think fit. A Trustee-Director may, and the Secretary at the request of a Trustee-Director shall, call a meeting of the Trustee-Directors. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting to a Trustee-Director who is absent from the United Kingdom. Questions arising at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In the case of an equality of votes, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 53.** The quorum for the transaction of the business of the Trustee-Directors may be fixed by the Trustee-Directors and unless so fixed at any other number shall be two (2) or one third (1/3) of the Trustee-Directors (whichever shall be the lower).
- 54.** The continuing Trustee-Directors or a sole continuing Trustee-Director may act notwithstanding any vacancies in their number, but, if the number of Trustee-Directors is less than the number fixed as the quorum, the continuing Trustee-Directors or Trustee-Director may act only for the purpose of filling vacancies or of calling a general meeting.

- 55.** The Trustee-Directors may appoint one of their number to be the chairman of the board of Trustee-Directors and may at any time remove him from that office. Unless he is willing to do so, the Trustee-Director so appointed shall preside at every meeting of Trustee-Directors at which he is present but if there is no Trustee-Director holding that office, or if the Trustee-Director holding it is unwilling to preside or is not present within five (5) minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the Trustee-Directors present may appoint one of their number to be chairman of the meeting.
- 56.** All acts done by a meeting of Trustee-Directors, or of a committee of Trustee-Directors, or by a person acting as a Trustee-Director shall, notwithstanding that it be afterwards discovered that there was a defect in the appointment of any Trustee-Director or that any of them were disqualified from holding office, or had vacated office, or were not entitled to vote, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified and had continued to be a Trustee-Director and had been entitled to vote.
- 57.** A resolution in writing signed (including by way of electronic signature) by all the Trustee-Directors entitled to receive notice of a meeting of Trustee-Directors or of a committee of Trustee-Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of Trustee-Directors as (as the case may be) a committee of Trustee-Directors duly convened and held and may consist of several documents in the like form each signed by one or more Trustee-Directors.
- 58.** Save as otherwise provided by the Articles, a Trustee-Director shall not vote at a meeting of Trustee-Directors or of a committee of Trustee-Directors on any resolution concerning a matter in which he has, directly or indirectly, an interest or duty which is material and which conflicts or may conflict with the interests of the Charity unless his interest or duty arises only because the case falls within one or more of the following paragraphs:
- (a) the resolution relates to the giving to him of a guarantee, security or indemnity in respect of money lent to, or an obligation incurred by him for the benefit of, the Charity or any of its subsidiaries;
  - (b) the resolution relates to the giving to a third party of a guarantee, security or indemnity in respect of an obligation of the Charity or any of its subsidiaries for which the Trustee-Director has assumed responsibility in whole or part and whether alone or jointly with others under a guarantee or indemnity or by the giving of security;
  - (c) his interest arises by virtue of his subscribing or agreeing to subscribe for any debentures of the Charity or any of its subsidiaries or by virtue of his being, or intending to become, a participant in the underwriting or sub-underwriting of an offer of any such debentures by the Charity or any of its subsidiaries for subscription, purchase or exchange;
  - (d) the resolution relates in any way to a retirement benefits scheme which has been approved, or is conditional upon approval, by the Board of Inland Revenue for taxation purposes.
- An interest of a person who is, for any purpose of the Act (excluding any statutory modification thereof not in force when this regulation becomes binding on the Charity), connected with a Trustee-Director shall be treated as an interest of the Trustee-Director.
- 59.** A Trustee-Director shall not be counted in the quorum present at a meeting in relation to a resolution on which he is not entitled to vote.
- 60.** The Charity may by ordinary resolution suspend or relax to any extent, either generally or in respect of any particular matter, any provision of the Articles prohibiting a Trustee-Director from voting at a meeting of Trustee-Directors or of a committee of Trustee-Directors.
- 61.** Where proposals are under consideration concerning the appointment of two or more Trustee-Directors to offices or employments with the Charity or any body corporate in which the Charity is interested the proposals may be divided and considered in relation to each Trustee-Director separately and (provided he is not for another reason

precluded from voting) each of the Trustee-Directors concerned shall be entitled to vote and be counted in the quorum in respect of each resolution except that concerning his own appointment.

62. If a question arises at a meeting of Trustee-Directors or of a committee of Trustee-Directors as to the right of a Trustee-Director to vote, the question may, before the conclusion of the meeting, be referred to the chairman of the meeting and his ruling in relation to any Trustee-Director other than himself shall be final and conclusive.

#### **VIRTUAL MEETINGS**

63. A meeting may be held by telephone or by televisual or other electronic or virtual means agreed by resolution of the Trustee-Directors in which all participants may communicate simultaneously with all other participants.

#### **SECRETARY**

64. Subject to the provisions of the Act, the Secretary shall be appointed by the Trustee-Directors for such term, at such remuneration and upon such conditions as they may think fit; and any Secretary so appointed may be removed by them.

#### **MINUTES**

65. The Trustee-Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books kept for the purpose:
- (a) of all appointments of officers made by the Trustee-Directors; and
  - (b) of all proceedings at meetings of the Charity, and of the Trustee-Directors, and of committees of Trustee-Directors, including the names of the Trustee-Directors present at each such meeting.

#### **THE SEAL**

66. The Seal shall only be used by the authority of the Trustee-Directors or of a committee of Trustee-Directors authorised by the Trustee-Directors and the Trustee-Directors may determine who shall sign any instrument to which the Seal is affixed and unless otherwise so determined it shall be signed by a Trustee-Director and by the Secretary or by two (2) Trustee-Directors.

#### **PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT AND PATRONS**

67. The Trustee-Directors may appoint any person to be the president and any person or persons to be vice-presidents or patrons of the Charity for such term or terms specified at the time of appointment as they shall think fit and such persons shall not by virtue only of such appointments be Trustee-Directors or members of the Charity.

#### **ACCOUNTS**

68. No member shall (as such) have any right of inspecting any accounting records or other book or document of the Charity except as conferred by statute or authorised by the Trustee-Directors or by ordinary resolution of the Charity.

#### **NOTICES**

69. Any notice to be given to or by any person pursuant to the Articles shall be in writing except that a notice calling a meeting of the Trustee-Directors need not be in writing.
70. The Charity may give any notice to a member either personally or by sending it by post in a prepaid envelope addressed to the member at his registered address or by leaving it at that address. A member whose registered address is not within the United Kingdom and who gives to the Charity an address within the United Kingdom at which notices may be given to him shall be entitled to have notices given to him at that address, but otherwise no such member shall be entitled to receive any notice from the Charity.

71. A member present, either in person or by proxy, at any meeting of the Charity shall be deemed to have received notice of the meeting and, where requisite, of the purposes for which it was called.
72. Proof that an envelope containing a notice was properly addressed, prepaid and posted shall be conclusive evidence that the notice was given. A notice shall be deemed to be given at the expiration of forty eight (48) hours after the envelope containing it was posted.

#### **WINDING UP**

73. On the winding-up and dissolution of the Charity the provisions of the Memorandum of Association shall have effect as if repeated in these Articles.

#### **INDEMNITY**

74. Subject to the provisions of the Act but without prejudice to any indemnity to which a Trustee-Director may otherwise be entitled, every Trustee-Director or other officer or auditor of the Charity shall be indemnified out of the assets of the Charity against any liability incurred by him in defending any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in his favour or in which he is acquitted or in connection with any application in which relief is granted to him by the court from liability for negligence, default, breach of duty or breach of trust in relation of the affairs of the Charity.
